The Academic Computing Committee discussed assessment of online classes at the October meeting. Dee Dee Johnston, chair of assessment committee at Hope was the guest at the committee meeting. Specifically, they discussed the results of student guided focus groups and a suvery of students at Hope who have taken online courses. Students like the ability to go at their own pass and some would like more interaction with faculty in the online courses. We also went over the NSSEE 2013 learning with

d) The **Curriculum Committee** Meeting took place on Thursday, October 17, at 11:00 a.m. in Martha Miller.

The committee considered 3 proposals:

- 1. New course: International Studies proposal for a new capstone course: Annie Dandavati, (Political Science), presented the purpose and rationale for this new course. The main goal of the course will be to give the coherence of a capstone course to the international studies major. The students will take the course in their senior year as a required course. The committee passed a motion to ask for the resubmission of the proposal addressing some areas of concern (name, assessment, financial and other department/programs impact) and affirming that the curriculum committee recognizes the significant of the course.
- 2. New minors: Department of Modern and Classical Languages (French section) and Studies in Ministry
  - a. French/ministry double minor.
  - b. French studies minor with ministry internship.

Anne Larsen (French) presented the purpose and rationale for these new minors. The minors will serve students with dual interest in French and ministry/mission. The minors will also include an off-campus internship at the Nibakure Children's Village in Rwanda. Some discussion regarding the difference between the double minor and two separated minor followed. The committee will continue the consideration of the proposals in the November meeting

e) Library Committee, 10/10/13 -- The Library Committee discussed reactions to the move of the music library to VanWylen, and examined a survey written by students. The survey will be discussed with student authors and possibly re-written to be used to gather additional feedback. Some students aren't happy with the move. Next, the committee discussed the Library's annual report from the past academic year. Highlights of the discussion included: library use statistics and a new way to count patrons, the addition of OneSearch, new objectives for literacy education, and major cuts and cost reductions for on-line subscriptions. Finally, Kelly informed the committee of a new assessment tool (survey) they will use, available through our membership in the Higher Education Data Sharing consortium. Overall impression: rapid changes in information dissemination create many challenges that call for constant re-evaluation and ongoing changes in the library.
