Jack Mulder '00 joined the Hope College faculty in 2004. Jack currently chairs the Department of Philosophy at Hope, co-directs the Initium program for new Hope faculty and serves as a Faculty Fellow in the Center for Ministry Studies. He is also the assistant director of the Saint Benedict Forum, a Catholic organization serving Hope College.

Jack writes and teaches in the areas of philosophy of religion, Catholic thought, applied ethics and the thought of Søren Kierkegaard. His new book, *What Does It Mean to Be Catholic?*, will be published by Eerdmans in July. Many of his publications and presentations have been made possible by collaborative research with Hope students.

## **AREAS OF EXPERTISE**

Jack specializes in the philosophy of religion, especially issues of Protestant-Catholic dialogue, interfaith dialogue and the thought of Søren Kierkegaard. 
## **OUTSIDE THE COLLEGE**
