


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- Challenge: How to resist being stretched too thin by increasing demands in teaching, scholarship, and service?
- Opportunity: How to make the most of the choices that open up after promotion?








- Objective 2: Students, faculty, and staff will be provided opportunities, support and resources to reflect purposefully and discourse charitably about the Christian faith.






Fall book discussion groups
